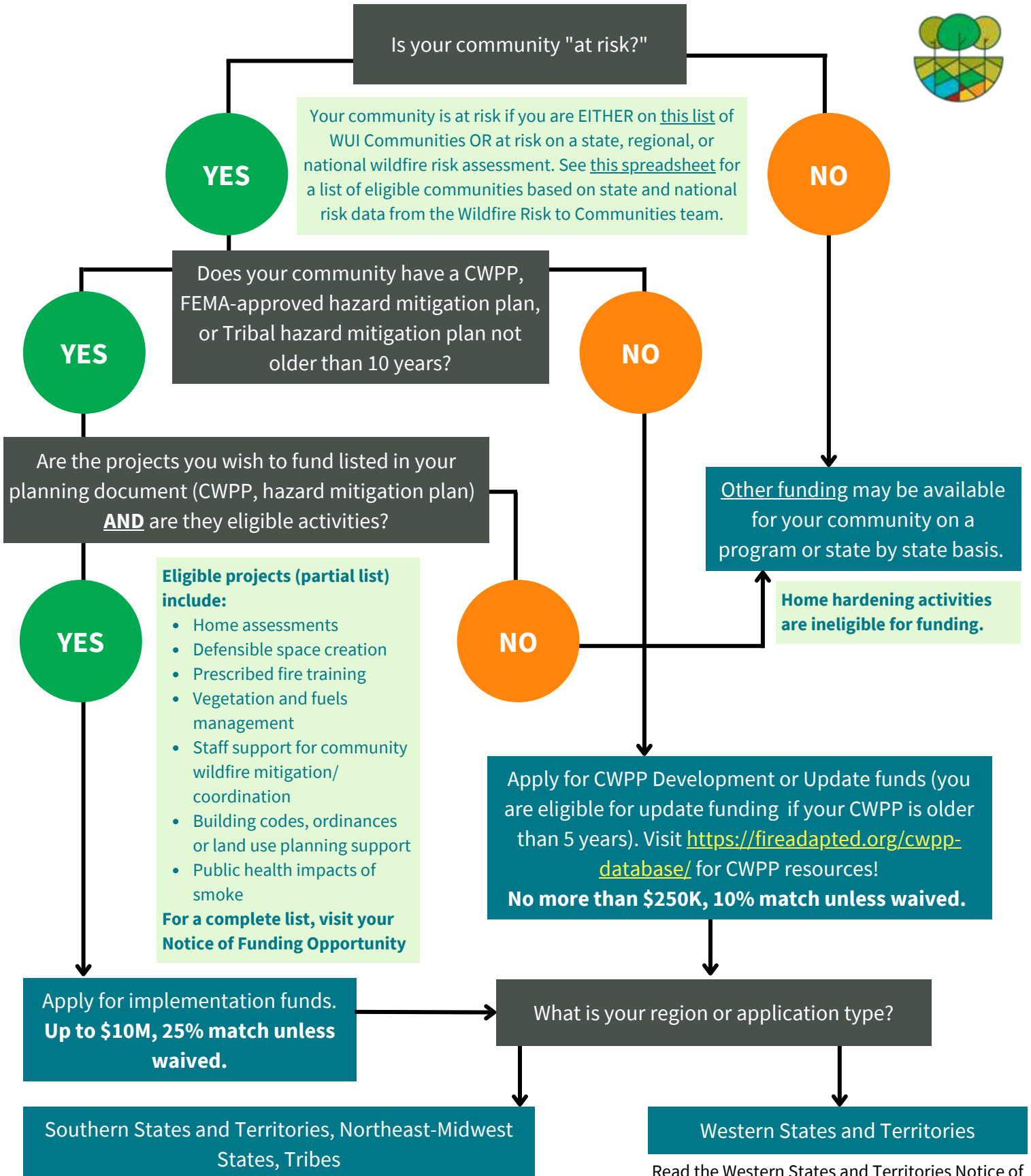


Applications **MUST** come from a local government, Tribe, non-profit organization, State forestry agency, or Alaska Native Corporation **AND** project work **MUST** occur on private, local government, state government, Homeowners Association, and/or Tribal/Alaska native corporation land (including Trust lands).



Your community is at risk if you are EITHER on [this list](#) of WUI Communities OR at risk on a state, regional, or national wildfire risk assessment. See [this spreadsheet](#) for a list of eligible communities based on state and national risk data from the Wildfire Risk to Communities team.

Does your community have a CWPP, FEMA-approved hazard mitigation plan, or Tribal hazard mitigation plan not older than 10 years?

Are the projects you wish to fund listed in your planning document (CWPP, hazard mitigation plan) **AND** are they eligible activities?

- Eligible projects (partial list) include:**
- Home assessments
 - Defensible space creation
 - Prescribed fire training
 - Vegetation and fuels management
 - Staff support for community wildfire mitigation/coordination
 - Building codes, ordinances or land use planning support
 - Public health impacts of smoke

[Other funding](#) may be available for your community on a program or state by state basis.

Home hardening activities are ineligible for funding.

Apply for CWPP Development or Update funds (you are eligible for update funding if your CWPP is older than 5 years). Visit <https://fireadapted.org/cwpp-database/> for CWPP resources!
No more than \$250K, 10% match unless waived.

Apply for implementation funds.
Up to \$10M, 25% match unless waived.
